Last weekend, I had initial training in implementing an International Baccalaureate Program at Key West High - It was very interesting to say the least. The International Baccalaureate exists twenty-seven countries throughout the world and features a rigorous curriculum which is developed and tested by the International Baccalaureate team. The program is mission driven and requires a specific set of skills to be successful. The main mission statement is that the program aims "to develop, inquiring, knowledgeable, and caring young people who help to create a better more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect. " In addition to a clearly focused mission, a learner profile is established for students which include many of the Skills, Tony Wagner, in his book, "The Global Achievement Gap," establishes as 21st requirements for success such as being inquirers, thinkers, communicators, caring, risk-takers, balanced and reflective. I held a coffee hour last Wednesday to talk to our teachers about the program, they are very interested in pursuing training that is being offered this year. This week Neda Preston (Math Department) and Nora Laubenstein (Social Studies) are attending training and in December, we have several more participants. Student s who graduate with an IB Diploma are often admitted to college to their sophomore rather than freshman year and they are admitted to the most prestigious schools because the diploma program uses a testing program which is scored by IB officials in Geneva and is recognized internationally for its high quality.
