CREDIT RECOVERY COURSES

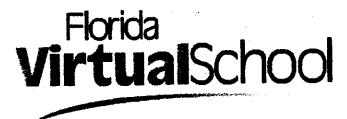
- are aligned to the goals of the FLDOE course descriptions
- may not replace a student's grade (dependent on district)
- are not NCAA approved

STUDENTS MUST

- have previously failed the particular course to be eligible
- make at least 10% progress in the course each week
- complete the course in no more than 10 weeks
- attend weekly mandatory live Illuminate sessions

Students will be withdrawn from the course if they fail to meet all of the above requirements.
