Silver Knight Award

Coral Shores High School 24-25

Overview: The Silver Knight Award is a prestigious recognition program sponsored by the Miami Herald and el Nuevo Herald. It honors high school seniors in Miami-Dade and Broward counties for their outstanding academic achievements and significant community service contributions.

History:

- **Established:** 1959 by John S. Knight, founder of Knight-Ridder Newspapers and Pulitzer Prize winner.
- **Purpose:** To celebrate students who excel academically and contribute positively to their communities.

Eligibility:

- Who Can Apply: High school seniors from public, private, and parochial schools in Miami-Dade and Broward counties.
- **Academic Requirement:** Minimum unweighted GPA of 3.2.
- Categories: Students can be nominated in 15 categories, including Art, Athletics, Business, Digital & Interactive Media, Drama, English & Literature, General Scholarship, Journalism, Mathematics, Music & Dance, Science, Social Science, Speech, Vocational Technical, and World Languages.

Nomination Process:

- School Nomination: Each school can nominate one student per category.
- **Application:** Students must submit an application detailing their academic achievements and community service projects.
- Judging: Includes student interviews and evaluation of their contributions and impact.

Awards:

- **Recognition:** Winners receive a Silver Knight statue and a cash award.
- Honorable Mentions: Recognized with certificates and medallions.

Impact:

- **Community Service:** Projects designed by nominees often address critical community needs, showcasing their leadership and dedication.
- **Legacy:** Over 20,000 students have been recognized since the program's inception, with more than \$1 million in cash awards distributed.

Ceremony:

- **Event:** The awards ceremony is a formal event where all nominees are honored, and winners are announced.
- Date: Typically held in May each year.

The Silver Knight Award winners are selected based on several key criteria:

- 1. Service: The extent and impact of the nominee's community service projects.
- 2. Achievements: Academic accomplishments and other notable achievements.
- 3. Character: Demonstration of integrity, responsibility, and ethical behavior.
- 4. Leadership: Leadership roles and the ability to inspire and guide others.
- 5. Interview Skills: Performance during the interview process, including communication skills and the ability to articulate their experiences and contributions.

Two major factors that judges particularly consider are the **consistency** and **lasting impact** of the nominee's service.
