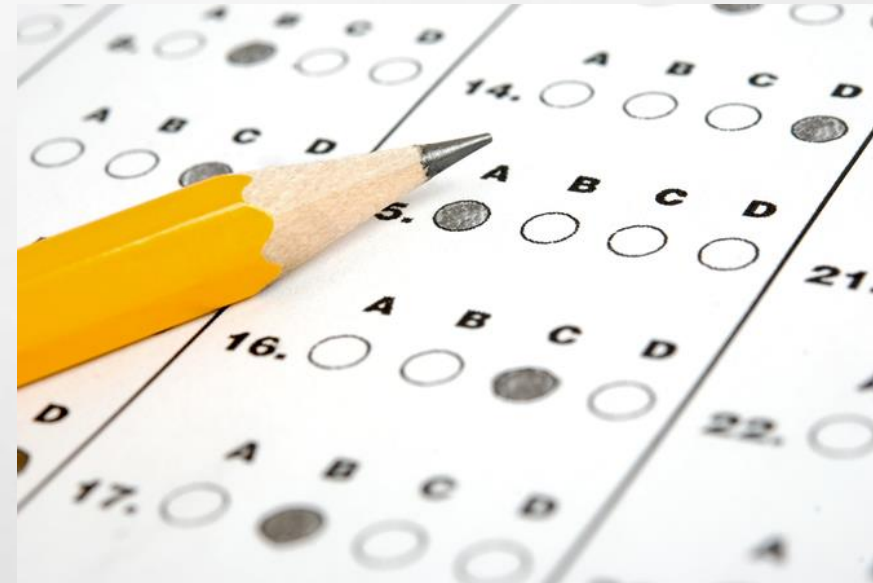

 - ✓ Future Gainful Employment
- ✓ Identify what's "put you on hold". Talk to Mrs. Estenoz

Step 2: Choose A Career Path & College

Top considerations for selecting a college:

- 1.** Program offering (degree, research, jobs, accreditation, sports)
- 2.** Affordability (FCPP, in-state tuition, BF, staying home, program length)
- 3.** Location (in-state, financial/work, weather, proximity to home.)
- 4.** Willingness to commit future personal finances.

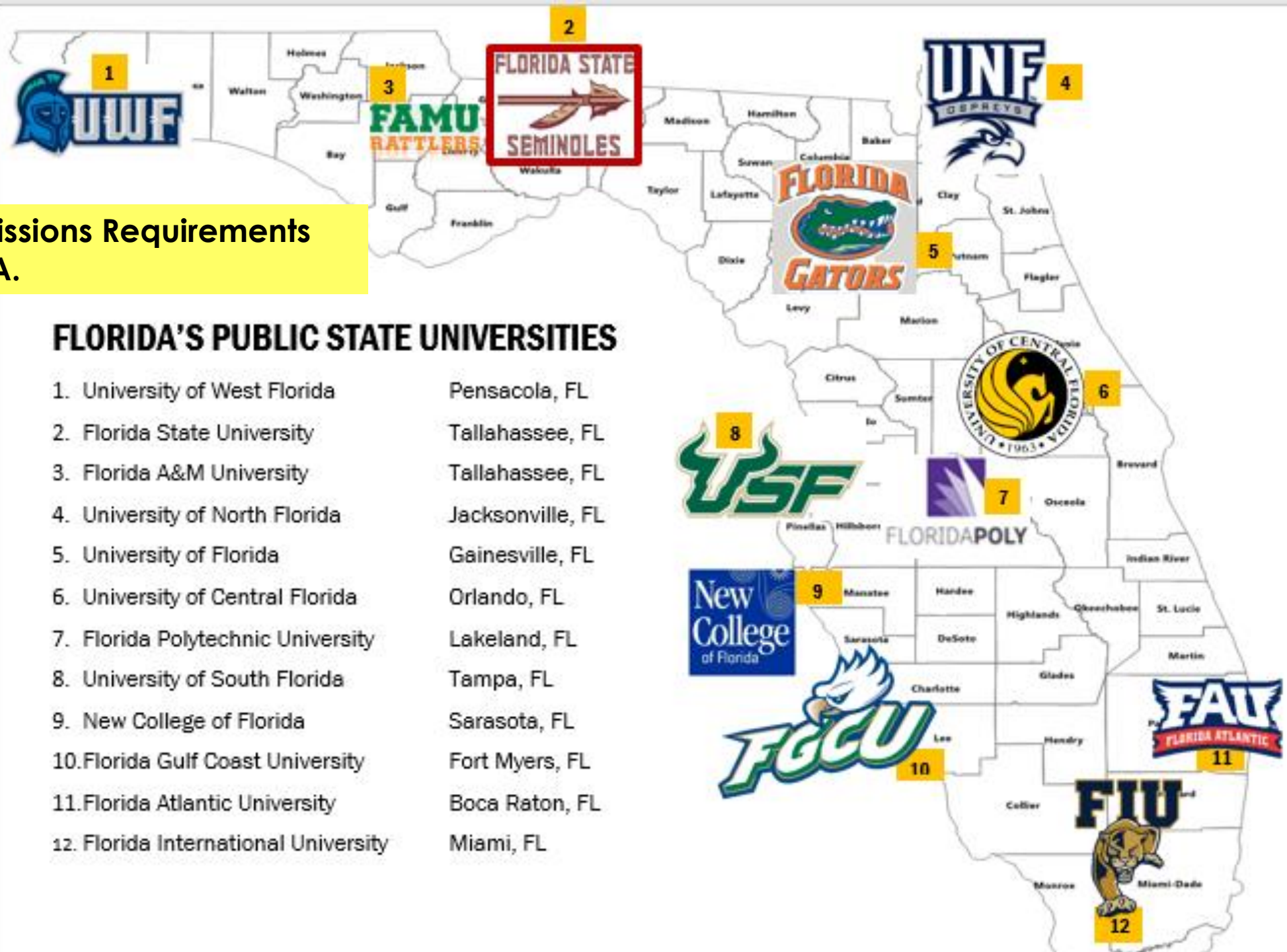

3RD LARGEST SOURCE OF FUNDING LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS FOR KWHS SENIORS

They start rolling out by mid-February.

- Some opportunities are “selections” and do not have an application process according to the wishes of the donor
- All local scholarships require that applicants have submitted college or vocational school applications/can provide proof that you are pursuing higher education after high school for eligibility
- Some local scholarships require the completion of the FAFSA for an SAR.
- Many local scholarship applications require letters or forms of recommendation from teachers and community members.
- Some local scholarship applications require essays. Make sure you're doing your best work.
- Some local scholarship applications require official transcripts.

WHY DO COMMUNITY SERVICE?

- Complete between 75–100 hours– counts from after 8th grade.
- Needed for many local scholarships as well as for bright futures
- 300+ needed for senior pin recognition later on this year
- Service must be related to a social issue; ideally, it should connect to the field you would like to pursue after high school
