





They start rolling out by mid-February.

- Some opportunities are "selections" and do not have an application process according to the wishes of the donor
- All local scholarships require that applicants have submitted college or vocational school applications/can provide proof that you are pursuing higher education after high school for eligibility
- Some local scholarships require the completion of the FAFSA for an SAR.
- Many local scholarship applications require letters or forms of recommendation from teachers and community members.
- Some local scholarship applications require essays. Make sure you're doing your best work.
- Some local scholarship applications require official transcripts.

WHY DO COMMUNITY SERVICE?

- Complete between 75-100 hours- counts from after 8th grade.
- Needed for many local scholarships as well as for bright futures
- 300+ needed for senior pin recognition later on this year
- Service must be related to a social issue; ideally, it should connect to the field you would like to pursue after high school
