


Q1 - Which School does your child attend? - Selected Choice


Q2 - I feel welcome when I enter/contact the school.




Q4 - I feel knowledgeable about the school's expectations for my child.



Q5 - I feel knowledgeable about what is going on at the school.






Q7 - I feel knowledgeable about the Title I program.




Q10 - The school provides our family with parenting resources and a parent resource center.
