





All senior vaccine records have been reviewed for the class of 2025, the seniors will have received their information by Friday (if they haven't, it may be due to absences and please have them come to the KWHS Clinic.) We are offering a vaccine clinic by the Monroe County Health Department on the morning of March 27th, if your senior is missing the Meningococcal (meningitis vaccine) which is mandatory for most colleges and universities they can receive it then as well as recommended vaccines such as Hep A and HPV. If you have questions, please call the clinic at 305-293-1549 ext 54311. Permission slips for this vaccine opportunity must be returned to the nurse by March 10th. *There will be no out of pocket cost regardless of insurance status. You also can contact your pediatrician or medical provider about getting these vaccines at their office. The QR code below will take you to the information sheets on the vaccines.

He leads with quiet confidence, scoring in the top .07% in the United States on the math section of the PSAT -10. 

Key West High School was honored with a banner and plaque for 100 years of accreditation. Mike Andrews, from Cognia, was on hand in the afternoon to present the banner to the staff in celebration of the outstanding accomplishment. He then attended the school board meeting and was joined by Superintendent Axford and Chair Conn to share the distinction of the 100 years award and presented Principal Palomino with an award.



In 1895, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools was recognized by the Department of Education to oversee the accreditation of public and private degree-granting institutions. In 1924, Key West High School earned its first accreditation, signifying that it met the rigorous standards set forth by the agency. Over the years, various accrediting agencies came together to create a single, comprehensive organization dedicated to advancing the quality of education for students worldwide.




The accreditation process includes school site visits by trained team members who delve into all aspects of a school, from academics and operations to assessment data. Recommendations for commendation and improvement are among the guidelines for a school's growth. Over the past 20 years, the Monroe County School District (MCS D) has become an accredited district, with all ten public schools earning the distinction from Cognia, the new organization.

Today, we celebrate Key West High School's 100th Anniversary of Accreditation! This honor is a testament to the tenacity, hard work, and dedication of 100 years of faculties, administrators, and community support. It is proudly accepted by current principal Rebecca Palomino and her staff, who continue to uphold the high ideals of Cognia and accreditation.





Valentine's Day brought an origami challenge to Mrs. Rech's AVID 2 classes today! At this point in the year, students often feel the weight of increased rigor in their core classes, which can be overwhelming. To take a mindful break while reinforcing valuable skills, students followed a step-by-step video to create origami hearts. At first, moans of frustration filled the room, but with patience and persistence, those groans turned into triumphant shouts of, "I did it!" This simple yet powerful activity served as a reminder that patience, practice, and perseverance can turn challenges into successes both in academics and in life.



KWHS HOPE classes received a grant for approximately \$3000 that included the purchase of 5 blood pressure monitors, 5 smart scales, and 31 heart rate monitors. Approximately 120 HOPE students took their blood pressure and heart rate while learning the difference between systolic and diastolic pressures. They also learned the dangers of high blood pressure and the habits that can help reduce risks of hypertension.
